Auditor gives city's books a clean bill of health

The accountant hired for an annual audit of the

city praised staff members' bookkeeping to the City Council at its meeting Monday night. Danielle Hollingshead, lead auditor with Adams Brown, said that for one

paving job worth more than \$100,000 last year, the city should have required the contractor to carry a performance bond, a sort of insurance. But the contractor in this case, APAC, is well established and Hollingshead said the matter was "very small." Holly Lofton, director of the Convention & Visitors Bureau, said the system installed after the center opened in 2013 is obsolete, with microphones that look like they'd been dropped from the second story, and a projector that doesn't clearly show pictures and no longer meets the demands

The payment will go to Hopp's Sound, of McPherson. Hopp sold the original, "gently used" system to the city and has maintained it, Lofton's report said. They were chosen without putting the replacement to bid because their familiarity with the setup would mean less installation labor cost, which for Hopp's was estimated at \$760. Lofton said at the meeting that she'd looked and found no

In the Hopp's estimate for the city, more than half of the upgrade will go to buy an Epson projector for \$3,949. Two Shure wireless microphones will total \$1,198, and a microphone system \$489. A used eight-channel mixer will cost \$429. A ceiling mount for the projector, if needed, will be \$249.

The replacement was already budgeted.
