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Court restores ability to change gender markers

TOPEKA — A three-judge appeals court panel on June 13 cleared the way for Kansans to resume changing their gender markers on driver's licenses, rejecting arguments made by Attorney General Kris Kobach and overturning a lower court ruling.

The Kansas Court of Appeals panel ordered the case return to the district court level to be heard by someone other than Shawnee County District Judge Teresa Watson, who abused her discretion and committed legal

and factual errors, according to

Judges Karen Arnold-Burger, Stephen Hill, and Sarah Warner determined the state would suffer no harm by allowing transgender residents to be identified by their "gender," which is a personal identity or expression, rather than their "sex," which relates to reproductive systems. Kobach's office had argued that the two terms are interchangeable.

The Legislature passed a law in 2023 that requires vital statistics to recognize a person's biological

sex at birth. Kobach sued the Kansas Department of Revenue for continuing to allow transgender residents to change the gender markers on their driver's license, as the office had done since at least 2007.

From 2011 to 2022, KDOR issued 9,316,937 driver's licenses. During that period, 380 drivers changed their gender marker.

Watson in 2023 issued a temporary injunction to block changes in gender markers on driver's licenses. The appeals court, which heard arguments in January, removed that injunction and replaced it with an order to allow changes.

Watson, the higher court said, had committed a legal error by concluding, without any support, that Kobach's mere allegation that KDOR was violating state law had established irreparable harm. Additionally, the higher court faulted Watson's conclusion that changing a gender marker could hinder law enforcement officers.

"The problem with the district court's finding is that the AG presented no evidence to support this claimed injury beyond unsubstantiated speculation,"

Arnold-Burger wrote.

At the district court level, Shawnee County Sheriff Brian Hill testified that one time, he didn't say when, he arrested a transgender woman who told him that she was a man. One of the problems with that example, Arnold-Burger wrote, is that he relied on the individual's "outward appearance," not their driver's license. And, she wrote, the same mistake could be made for any cisgender woman who appears less feminine and more masculine than the average

Old business

Councilman Jackson presented the data he has gathered, showing totals from 2024 to present. Currently, there is no immediate need to raise water rates. However, rates will need to be increased in order for the city to qualify for grants. Tracy mentioned that the Kansas Rural Water Association offers a rate study, and he will contact them about coming out. This topic will be tabled for further discussion.

Maintenance report

K4 Project is going along nicely. There has been a set back with parts and state has extended 31 days.

Department reports

Jackson - The fire truck he was looking at has sold.

Cathey - Concerns were raised about the people parking south of the Catholic Church, noting that vehicles make it hard to pass while Sunday service is happening. He believes the road has narrowed due to construction on city property. Mayor Kruse mentioned that a retaining wall was to be put in by the Augustine's when the pool was built but has not been installed. Stephanie Moyer indicated that there is often water or mud at the corner of Maple and 9th Street when she picks

up her grandkids from daycare. The council needs to find a solution for getting the water off the road and figure out who is responsible since one councilmember believes it is built on city property. Additionally, a tree at the former Faleber property needs trimming, as it is being hit by spray-

Bickel - Questioned the update of the concession stand. Tracy stated concrete is still needing to be poured, with weather and other city issues Tracy has not had time to get it completed. Travis Smith will help with placing of the pipes for water and sewer. The city will need volunteer help once the exterior walls and bathrooms are completed. At 8th and Spring the culvert is filled in and does not drain. Tracy told him this was looked at last summer and there is a gas line that runs under 8th Street, and was noted all culverts need to be cleaned

Public comments

Delores was present to get information on what it would take for her to get a new sidewalk in front of her businesses. Council told her to bring back two or more quotes for review then can go further.

Gary was present to inform the council about his car that was damaged due to what he claims was the pothole in the road. Councilmen Cathey told him a timeline can be made of when the incident first happened and when he informed the city.

Mr. Olson attended to inquire about his water meter, which was included in his rural water agreement. Mayor Kruse explained that the agreement was signed 18 to 20 years ago, stating that the meter was to be installed within a reasonable timeframe. Mr. Olson requested to have the meter relocated closer to Niles and K4, but he states he was informed by the previous city clerk that this move was not possible. He will need to provide proof of payment before the issue can proceed further. Councilmen Cathey and Jackson advised Mr. Olson that they are not

opposed to the street he would like to pursue, but he must demonstrate progress for the city to move forward.

Mr. Hanneman stated he has checked with his insurance and has \$1000 deductible. He was given multiple numbers from Long Macarthur and online to contact the makers of Shelby to try and find parts and was unsuccessful. Councilmen Cathey told him he could find the parts for him and would get in contact with him.

New business

Councilmen Jackson made a motion to go into executive session for 15 minutes regarding city concerns, all in favor.

Councilmen Jackson made a motion to return, all in favor.

The dog ordinance 1303 was discussed, which includes provisions regarding dogs. Officer Heinrich informed the council that the Salina Animal Shelter



currently does not have space for additional intakes. Councilman Cathey suggested that the city send a letter requesting the removal of the animal without involving law enforcement, explaining the reasons for the removal. Officer Heinrich agreed that this would be a good starting point and recommended documenting any non-compliance. If necessary, the sheriff's department would then become involved, and a court order could be

Councilman Murphy made a motion to pay the bills totaling \$336,905.73, as well as any other bills

that become due before June 9th. This motion was seconded by Councilman Jackson, the motion passed. Mayor Kruse intends to appoint Stephanie Moyer
