The City of Bushton will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, April 15, 2025 at 6:00 pm in the Bushton City Hall located at 500 S. Main, Bushton, Kansas for the purpose of evaluating the performance of Grant No. 22-PF-014 which was for the construction of two new water wells, transmission line and appurtenances in an area generally bounded by the corporate city limits.

The proposed project consisted of the following items: 1 LS mobilization, 1 LS construction staking, 1 LS erosion control, 1 LS seeding, 1 LS site grading/ earthwork/field entrance, 1,750 LF fencing, 2 Each water wells, 1 L.S. abandonment of existing wells, 1 LS miscellaneous piping, valves, meter vaults, and appurtenances, 1 LS chlorination building/vault, 1 LS power company electrical connection, 1 LS electrical, 1 LS generator, 1 LS telemetry, 5,150 LF supply piping, 1 LS connection to existing system and 1 LS bulk water dispenser.
