One small step in that direction is sharing the stories of folks who are working hard to bring themselves and their families out of poverty. Our hope is that by hearing the

stories of our neighbors in McPherson County, we might all gain a better understanding of how we can work together to end poverty in our community.

Hinnergardt, and I am a proud leader from STEPMC. I was born in Dodge City in 1989 and have lived in 14 different towns across Kansas and Colorado. In my teenage years I rebelled and ended up

starting a 20-year battle with addiction. In 2023 I was arrested and spent 2 months in Reno County jail. When I was arrested, I lost my daughter to the State of Kansas. On My name is Nicholas March 11th 2023, I made the choice to change my life and got into Oxford House in Hutchinson. In November 2023, I moved back to McPherson to open an Oxford House, then I started going back to college, got involved with STEPMC, and moved into the Oak Harbor Cottages in January of 2024. By March 1st I had regained residential custody of my daughter and started doing the Getting Ahead class which I graduated from in August 2024.

While participating in the Getting Ahead class, I learned that there are 11 resources ranging from financials to social capital to language. Some of the resources are common knowledge, but until I

took the class, I didn't realize how vital they were. You could have all the financials in the world and still be in a state of poverty without other resources. Through the combination of the 11 resources, you find a way to survive through times of hardship and eventually get out of poverty. My favorite resource out of all of them is language. It feels good to know that I can go from a room of middle-class individuals to a room full of people in poverty and be able to talk to them all.

STEPMC has really

made an impact on my life and taught me a lot about what it means to exit poverty and how to make it happen. The people involved in the program have some of the kindest hearts I have ever known, and they would do everything in their power to help people grow and get a handle on exiting poverty. All around, I believe that STEPMC is a vital part of this community.
