Down Memory Lane

June 5, 1930

May 30, 1930, was a great day for Alton, the occasion being the unveiling of the monument in honor of General Hiram C. Bull.

According to plans recently announced by the state highway commission, U.S. Hwy 36 through Smith County will be surfaced with the local limestone gravel, which is said to have a large measure the same ingredients as the material used with marked success on some of the roads in Osborne County, notably the stretch which links Portis and Osborne.

May 23, 1935

Ralph Kendig last Friday sold the Kendig Coffee Shop on the north side of Main to Harvey Ward, Bloomington. Mr. Ward, who had been farming recently held a farm sale to dispose of his property. He took charge of the shop last Saturday and renamed it Ward's Cafe.

Manhattan paper say the number of 40N is to be changed and that soon the highway will be known as U.S. Highway 24. The road runs from Toledo, Ohio to Colorado Springs, Colo.

Orville Wagner, who has been employed by the Wilcox Cafe resigned last week to take over the local management of the Coca Cola route.

May 23, 1940

Last Thursday night about 11:30, in the midst of a severe thunder storm, the local fire department was called to the home of Mr. & Mrs. Fred Reed on North First Street, where lightning had set fire to the house. The blaze was confined principally to the roof and attic.


