

The Marks of a Dictator

A dictator accumulates power seizing it from other branches of government, other levels of government (states and cities), and from the people them-

He works to expand the nation or empire by bullying or waging war against other countries.

He typically is a narcissist, fancying himself as smarter or better than anyone else. He selects and promotes internal and or external

enemies for the nation to hate. A dictator dehumanizes his opponents, describing them with terms like "enemies, vermin, luna-

tics, traitors." He attacks the media, not just with accusations and name calling, but with lawsuits, governmental investigations, threats to remove broadcast licens-

es, and withdrawals of funding. A dictator undermines judges who fail to agree with him, by publishing smearing accusations, attempting to remove them from office, and refusing to obey court orders.

He portrays himself as a messiah or savior for a nation in distrett.

He lies with impunity to the public to strengthen his hand as leader and create an image of greatness.

He attacks cultural institutions including museums, the arts, and non-profits who fail to follow his lead. He sues universities and threatens public school

if they harbor divergent opinions.

He uses his political power to manipulate the courts, bureaucracy, and law enforcement to harass or silence perceived enemies.

He creates a national police force or employs military forces to control the streets.

He erodes civil liberties beginning with his targeted hate groups.

He appoints leaders who lack professional expertise and whose first loyalty is to him, rather than to the constitution or the nation as a whole.
