
Competitors came from all over the state including Olathe, Andover, Wichita, Cimarron, and more.

Thanks be to God for the opportunity to write to you all, I pray this finds you well. Here begins what I envision as a five-part series of exhortation to the local church body and will be basing the ensuing articles on Romans chapter 1, verses 1-20, beginning with verses 1-4 (In the ESV translation; I encourage you to open up and follow along!)

Normally, when a well-known apostle such as our beloved Paul addresses himself as a servant of Christ, we skim over until we find the "meat" of the passage. This doesn't catch our attention unless we hold it up in comparison to Acts 7:58, where the garments of those who stone Stephen are laid at the feet of one Saul, or as we know him now: Paul. The transition from sentencing Christians to their death to now being a slave of the Messiah Jesus is in fact the proclamation of a radical salvation. Something has changed Paul's life, just as the Holy Spirit has raised us as Christians to new life, and he is not hiding his new identity. So I ask you, Christian: who are you and whose message do you carry? Remember that you are called just as Paul was to share the good news of Jesus Christ and how He has transformed your life. As the apostle was set apart, so have we been chosen by God for a time such as this to speak out on account of His testimony- the script He's been writing since before the foundations of the earth were laid: Jesus Christ came to save sinners! Of whom, like Paul says of himself, I am the foremost. This is no new concept, not even one born in the New Testament, but born in the context of humanity's fall in the garden: "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and

between your offspring and her offspring; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel." (Genesis 3:15, ESV) Our Jesus is the fulfillment of this promise made to our forefather Adam that one day God would crush the head of the deceiver forever. He did this by sending His Son in the flesh to share in the suffering and humiliation of being human, who would ultimately forfeit His life on the cross to pay the debt owed for mankind's sin against God. In a display of God's own power, proving the deity of Jesus as the powerful Son of God, He was raised from the dead by the Spirit to be our forerunner; to lead us Himself into the presence of God our Father. Church I am writing to you today to call to your mind the work of salvation God has done in your life. I'm writing to you today to remind you that it is not our own message that we share-God was, is, and always will be the author and perfector of our salvation. In short, I'm writing to you today that from the scripture you might receive the Spirit afresh and continue preaching Christ and Him crucified.
