Pastor's Ponderings

Before we begin with this week's article, mercy by laying our punishment on the would you take a moment to pray for the local Body of Christ? We are together in the battle against the world, the flesh, and the devil; even conflict within our individual churches. Therefore, I have this to say to you: "Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery trial when it comes upon you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you," (1 Peter 4:12 ESV). "But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. For we have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original confidence firm to the end. (Hebrews 3:14-15). "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us," (Romans 8:18).

I now move to our next section in Romans 1, meditating on verses 5-7. Paul builds on the foundation of the gospel as the source of both the ability and ministry concerning the gospel taken to those (Gentiles) who do not yet know God. Who is the foundation of your ministry? I refer you to Matthew 7: 24-27 to encourage and admonish you in Christ with the familiar lyrics: "Our hope is built on nothing less, than Jesus blood and righteousness... on Christ the solid Rock I stand, all other ground is sinking sand."

God's unmerited favor toward humans in the gospel is the driving force He's chosen to bring His children to saving faith- that means you, Christian! You who are called to belong to Jesus Christ are loved by God. Let that sink in as you repeat it to yourself again. Though our God is a righteous and just Judge, He has shown us shoulders of Jesus! What greater motivation is there to go and tell the world "Our Savior lives" than our God has chosen to smile upon us when He should frown (Joel Beeke, Revelation). Let this be your life source today: "There is therefore now no condemnation for those that are in Christ Jesus." You are free to worship the Almighty and He has called you to be a saint- a living, breathing worshiper of God.

You've heard it said," He who has been forgiven much will love much." Know this, Christian, we have been forgiven much (more than we could ever understand) and in return received the immeasurable riches of God's grace; in Jesus we have peace with God. How much does your God love you? Enough to give His only Son to death in order that we might receive life. Let this fill your heart with courage as you take His gospel to those who have yet to know Him.
