Deer accidents

Albert R. Ponder, 64, Waverly, was traveling west on 24th Road, when he was unable to avoid a deer crossing the roadway. His 2007 Ford F-150 sustained more than \$1,000 in damage. Ponder was wearing a seat belt and was not injured in the accident occurring 4:30 a.m. Wednesday, March 5.

Drake Alan Shepard, 24, LeRoy, was traveling west on 11th Road, one-quarter mile west of Oxen Road, when he was unable to avoid a collision with a deer crossing the roadway. His 2019 Kia Optima sustained more than \$1,000 in damage and was towed from the scene of the accident. Shepard and his passenger, Trevor L. 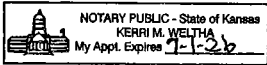
