No Hunger Summer at the Brown County Sheriff's Office kicked off on Monday, June 2 on the office's west side parking lot.

Brown County Historical Society curator and volunteer for No Hunger Summer said that free lunches would be given out to children during the summer.

"We're giving lunches out to anybody

under the age of 18," Merchant said. "Or if you have a disability this year, we can include you in that too."

People who are interested would drive to the west side parking lot, where there would be volunteers at a table handing out brown bag lunches, and they do not even have to get out of their vehicles.

"All you have to do is tell us how many you need and we'll give it to you," Merchant explained. The main goal of No Hunger Summer was giving lunches to kids who need food.

"It's free," she said. "You don't have to pay anything. It kind of bridges the gap at the end of school and at the beginning of school. We're here all June and we end August 1. We have lots of food."
