## RESOLUTION NO. 2025-004

## PONY EXPRESS HISTORIC BYWAY

WHEREAS, the Kansas Byways Advisory Committee (KBAC), consisting of representatives from Kansas Department of Transportation, Kansas Tourism, and Kansas Historical Society, has developed guidelines and policies regarding the designation of Kansas Scenic and Historic Byways; and

WHEREAS, a local advocate group has submitted an application to KBAC to develop a corridor management plan (CMP) that includes specific strategies and techniques to preserve, enhance and promote a historic byway; and

WHEREAS, the KBAC has evaluated this local committee's application and recommends that the Pony Express Historic Byway includes the route described as follows, to wit:

The Pony Express Historic Byway begins in Elwood, Kansas, traveling westward through northeastern Kansas, closely following the path once taken by Pony Express riders along US-36. The route turns south at Troy along KS-7 and then follows KS-20, through Everest and Horton. From there, it turns north on KS-75 until meeting back up with US-36 to the west of Fairview. The route then continues west on US-36 through Seneca, and Marysville, and into Washington County where it turns north at KS-148. The route goes past Hanover, and finally turns back east at KS-243 and ending at the Hollenberg Pony Express Station.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: By the City Commission of the City of Horton, Kansas, meeting in special session this 9th day of June 2025, the said route located within the city limits of Horton, Kansas, is hereby designated the Pony Express Historic Byway.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, the City of Horton, Kansas, shall not erect any sign, display, or device along any portion of the historic byway that is on the Interstate System, National Highway System, or Federal Aid Highway System, except signs in conformance with the applicable provisions of K.S.A. 68-2233.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall be forwarded to the KBAC as part of the corridor management plan to preserve the historic route.

ADOPTED by the Governing Body of the City of Horton, Kansas, on June 9, 2025.

## CHARTER RESOLUTION NO. 2025-12

A CHARTER RESOLUTION EXEMPTING BROWN COUNTY, KANSAS FROM CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF K.S.A. 65-201 ET SEQ., SPECIFICALLY K.S.A. 65-202 SUBSECTION (C) REGARDING ANNUAL SANITARY INSPECTIONS OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS BY THE LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER.

At a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Brown County, Kansas ("Board"), held on Monday, June 16, 2025, there came before the Board for consideration the matter of adopting Charter Resolution No. 2025-12 exempting Brown County, Kansas from K.S.A. 65-202(c) regarding annual sanitary inspections of school buildings and grounds by the local health officer.

The Board, being fully advised, and after thorough and careful deliberation, upon a motion duly made, seconded, and carried, adopted the following Charter Resolution No. 2025-12, to-wit:

**WHEREAS**, K.S.A. 19-101, et seq. provides that counties may exercise certain home rule powers, including adopting charter resolutions which exempt such counties from acts of the Kansas legislature, subject to certain restrictions contained in K.S.A. 19-101a; and

**WHEREAS**, Brown County, Kansas is a County within the meaning of the provisions of K.S.A. 19-101, et seq.; and

**WHEREAS**, K.S.A. 65-201 et seq. is not uniformly applicable to all counties within the state of Kansas; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Brown County Commissioners deems it necessary and advisable to exempt the County from certain provisions of K.S.A. 65-201 et seq., specifically K.S.A. 65-202 subsection (c) regarding annual sanitary inspections of schools.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Brown County, Kansas that Brown County, Kansas:

**Section 1.** That the foregoing recitals are incorporated in and made a part of this resolution by this reference.

**Section 2. Exemption.** That the Board by the power vested in it by K.S.A. 19-101a hereby elects to and does hereby exempt itself from and makes inapplicable to the County the provisions of K.S.A. 65-202 subsection (c) concerning only the requirements of the local health officer to inspect each school building and grounds at the opening of the fall term of school, and make additional inspections thereof as are necessary to protect the public health of the students of the school.

**Section 3. That it be further Resolved by the Board** that all other applicable statutory provisions of K.S.A. 65-201 et seq. not exempted by this Charter Resolution shall be and remain in effect and applicable to the County.

**Section 4. That it be further Resolved by the Board** that this Charter Resolution shall be published once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in the official County newspaper, and that this Charter Resolution shall then take effect sixty (60) days after its final publication unless, within that sixty (60) days, a sufficient petition, signed by the requisite number of qualified electors, is filed in the office of the County Election Officer demanding that the Charter Resolution be submitted to a vote of the electors, as provided in K.S.A. 19-101b, in which case, this Charter Resolution shall not become effective unless and until it is submitted to an election and approved by a majority of the electors voting upon it.

Charter Resolution No. 2025-12 is hereby adopted this 16th day of June 2025.
