Windfred Allen DeMott, age 84, resident of Bronaugh, Mo., died Saturday June 7, 2025, at the home. He was born Sept. 15, 1940, in Mound City, Kan., and his parents were Clyde Vernon DeMott and Alice Rosemond (Jackman) DeMott. He attended Mound City High School. He had worked at the Hydraulic Cement Plant in Ft. Scott, the Bourbon County Barn as a shop foreman, the City of Ft. Scott with the equipment maintenance dept., Bill's Coal Co., in Garland, Kan., and a few of the local rock quarry companies in Fort Scott.

He enjoyed restoring and parading his antique tractors. He attended many local festivals with his tractor collection. His 1937 vintage McCormick-Deering Farmall tractor was the featured tractor in the Pioneer Harvest Fiesta in 1994. In his later years, he spent his time spoiling the cows and feeding the chickens on the farm in Bronaugh.

His family included three children, a son, Allen DeMott, Fort Scott, and two daughters, Sheryl Crawley, Overland Park, Kan., and Shelly DeMott, Peculiar, Mo.; his friend for over thirty years, Carol (Griffiths) Claflin of Bronaugh; ten grandchildren; fourteen great-grandchildren; and two brothers, Delton De-Mott, Peck, Kan., and Roger DeMott, La Cygne, Kan. He was preceded in death by his parents and a sister, Cleta Fern Stump.

Heavenly Reality

We have all wondered about what heaven is like. Yet the Bible does not provide us a great deal of information as to what it is actually like. Most of our concepts of heaven are derived from hymns, like "I've Got a Mansion Just Over the Hilltop," rather than from Scripture. These songs provide us with great comfort concerning those who have passed away, and for our own future state. But the Bible only gives us "glimpses" of what heaven is like. Paul tells us that he was "caught up" to this paradise but was not permitted to talk about his experience (II Cor. 12:3-4).

Perhaps God knows that too much knowledge of this future state would cause us to lose focus on our mission here on planet Earth.

In modern times, Christianity has been criticized as a "pie-in-the-sky" religion. Karl Marx popularized the idea that religion is the opiate of

the masses; his proposal was that religion was invented and used by ruling classes to exploit and oppress the poor to keep them from revolting. The promise of "pie-in-thesky" was their means of keeping the oppressed obedient and content to wait for their reward in eternity.

But one cannot take Christianity seriously without recognizing the importance that is placed on the reality of heaven. It is integral to the New Testament; it played an import place in the teaching of Jesus and is the place of future reward. This reality enables us to endure trials and tribulations in the present, knowing that these are only temporal. We must live with our eyes focused on this reality, not ignoring the mission or the struggles of the present, but with the awareness that this is not "all that there is." Jesus said, "Do not let your heart be troubled.

Believe in God, believe also in me. In my Fathers' house there are many rooms. If it

were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?" (John 14:1-2).

Death is a reality that we often chose to ignore until we are confronted with it. James tells us that this life is simply a "mist," that will soon be blown away (James 4:14). That is the sobering reality that we do not like to face. Rich or poor, famous, or unknown, educated or illiterate, death is a reality. Yet for the believer in Christ, who conquered death, we know that the grave is not the end, but a new beginning. The Apostle Paul tells us that "Death is swallowed up in victory. O death where is your victory? O death where is your sting?" (I Cor. 15:54-55). We "pass through the valley of the shadow of death" (Ps. 23:4). Death is but a shadow. The shadow of a dog cannot bite you. The shadow of a knife cannot cut you. The shadow of a gun cannot shoot you. The shadow of death cannot harm you.
