Local Students Awarded Congressional Art Competition Honors





WICHITA – The office of Congressman Ron Estes (R-Kansas) announced the win-

Invenergy Plans Conway Springs Solar Array

Conway Springs farmer Tom Pauly attended Monday's Sumner County Commission meeting to discuss upcoming solar projects. Invenergy, which operates solar farms in the region, including Harper County and Sedgwick County, is planning a new solar array near Conway Springs. Pauly told the commission that he had agreed to lease about 1,000 acres, located just north of Conway Springs, to Invenergy. The company is seeking 5,000 acres to create a new 3,000 solar panel array, set to begin production next year. Invenergy is based out of Chicago and operate solar and wind farms, plus energy storage and production facilities worldwide. The company plans to request payment in lieu of taxes and property tax exemptions for 10 years.
