# Wellington City Council Meeting – June 17th Agenda, Meeting held June 18, 2025

Due to inclement weather on June 17, the meeting was held on June 18 2025. The City Council meeting opened with the call to order and pledge of allegiance. Councilman Kevin Dodds led the invocation. Councilman Rick Roitman gave prior notice to be absent for this meeting.

Audience participation began with a proclamation for Paul Ybarra's 100th Birthday. June 25th will officially be Paul Ybarra Day in the city of Wellington.

With the change in meeting date, Zach Cooper was not present to report on Cowley **County Community** College – Sumner Campus.

During Reports of Mayor and Council, Councilman Dodds thanked the city staff for being out in the storm and working on fixing things when they were down.

Councilwoman Jan Grace reiterated the thank you to city staff. She also reported that the Lion's Club is grateful to Jeremy Jones for his information to them



on the Aquatic Center, Candy Cane City, and the Veteran's Park.

Councilwoman Mary Lucas and Councilman Mike Westmoreland also thanked the city staff for the continued cleanup and assistance to the civilians of Wellington. Lucas also asked about updates on 421 North Poplar and city manager Jeff Porter stated he would look into it.

Mayor Joe Soria also thanked city officials for blocking off flooded areas in the city.

During reports of city officials, several street closing requests for the Wheat Festival and the 4th of July celebrations were approved by unanimous voice vote. Streets will be closed at the following addresses on July 4: 106 W. Lincoln to 114 W. Lincoln, 18th street to the alley on North C, South B street from Harvey to Lincoln, 19th street from Blaine

to the alley, 20th St to N Plum Street and 20th to High Street. The alley behind The Dore will be closed during the Kansas Wheat Festival.

The Wellington Recreational Center (WRC) asked that the appropriations they currently receive from the City be continued when they move activities into their new facility at 715 North Woodlawn. The WRC is currently funded together with the School District and the Special Drug and Alcohol Committee. The Council tabled the discussion for the end of July so that they may discuss the appropriations during the budget meeting and come to a decision.

No public hearing took place during the meeting.

An ordinance amending section 20-161 of the code of the City of Wellington, Kansas


pertaining to firework regulations and restrictions and repealing the originals of said section was discussed. The requested changes were that retail sales extend from 10am to 11pm from June 30 through July 5, discharging of fireworks extend from 10am to 11pm from June 30 through July 5 and extend to midnight on July 4. After discussion and motions, the ordinance did not pass, 0-5. Current guidelines remain in place.

A resolution approving the common consumption area as requested by the Regent Theater was discussed for July 3, 2025. The resolution was passed by a unanimous 5-0 vote.

A second resolution approving the common consumption area as requested by The Dore was discussed. This will be during the Wheat Festival. The resolution was passed by a unanimous 5-0 vote.

Future items mentioned were the July 8, 2025 Budget Work Session.

The City Council meeting was adjourned.


