

Kansas Crop Progress and Condition – Week Ending August 10, 2025

Kansas farmers saw another productive week in the fields, with 5.9 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service.

Soil Moisture:

Topsoil moisture was rated 6% very short, 20% short, 64% adequate, and 10% surplus. Subsoil moisture came in at 8% very short, 22% short, 62% adequate, and 8% surplus.

Corn:

Corn condition statewide was rated 3%

very poor, 9% poor, 27% fair, 42% good, and 19% excellent. Silking reached 90%, slightly behind last year's 95% but near the five-year average of 93%. Corn in the dough stage was at 68%, down from 77% last year but close to the 66% average. Corn dented reached 22%, just behind last year's 29% and similar to the 21% average.

Soybeans:

Soybean conditions are rated 1% very poor, 5% poor, 25% fair, 57% good, and 12% excellent. Blooming was at 79%, behind 85% last year and the 84% average.

Pod set was 54%, equal to last year and close to the 56% average.

Sorghum:

Sorghum condition rated 2% very poor, 7% poor, 27% fair, 45% good, and 19% excellent. Heading reached 55%, down from 68% last year and near the 59% average. Coloring was at 15%, slightly behind 19% last year but ahead of the 11% average.

Cotton:

Cotton condition rated 0% very poor, 9% poor, 43% fair, 34% good, and 14%

excellent. Bolls were setting on 73% of the crop, down from 82% last year but near the 71% average. Bolls opening was 2%, trailing 7% last year and just under the 5% average.

Pasture and Range:

Kansas pasture and range conditions rated 4% very poor, 9% poor, 24% fair, 52% good, and 11% excellent. This weekly report is based on data provided by the USDA Farm Service Agency, K-State Extension Service, and other reporters across the state.
