• Due to the recent lack of moisture leaving grass and woodland dry, the Jefferson County Board of Commissioners Friday passed a proclamation prohibiting burning in the county for the next 30 days.

• Mr. and Mrs. John Shomin, owners of Shomin Meat Processing, Oskaloosa, became grandparents Sunday of a seven pound, 12 ounce boy, Steven John Patrick Shomin.

Parents are Pat and Connie Shomin, Kansas City.

• An association to manage the summer ball program has been organized. The new group, Oskaloosa Ballpark Association, was formed on March 7 at a meeting to discuss plans for the summer ball program.

• An open house will be held at the Oskaloosa Public Library on April 11 to show off a new reference and study room. The new room, which is used by the city council for monthly meetings, is being dedicated in memory of the late Diane Finley, who was a library consultant.
