## Days of Yore

### 11 Years Ago

Six candidates in the Kingman City Commission election advanced from the primaries to the general election: Merlin McFarland, Charlus Bishop, Mark Arensdorf, Roland Belcher, Mark Schnittker and Elizabeth Madden; Bishop, Belcher and Madden were the three seeking re-election to the commission. The city commission got its first look at Kingman-Norwich Recreation Director Brandon Davidson's five-phase plan for Riverside Park, which would include closing off a section of roadway to improve safety of children during baseball games. The Kingman County Commission discussed what could be done about Carlyle W. Ploog leaving derelict vehicles at two locations near Rago and one near Cleveland; Ploog had been sent notices that he was in violation of zoning ordinances. Shelter Insurance Foundation agent Chad Osborn announced the foundation was taking applications for a \$2,000 scholarship to be awarded to a Kingman High School student. The Kingman girl's basketball team advanced in Sub State tournament play after beating Cheney 50-33 while the boy's team lost to Chaparral 56-47.

### 35 Years Ago

Craig Hacker had the winning photo in a Region 7 photography contest, which appeared in the Wichita Eagle; Hacker worked as a freelance photographer for the Leader-Courier and Kingman Journal and the photos were

for a news assignment from the Wichita Eagle. Kingman City Commissioners took no action on a request for an Industrial Park lease for a fertilizer plant until they got additional questions answered. A yellow ribbon tying ceremony was held in Kingman to show support for troops who were headed to the Persian Gulf after military action got underway to liberate Kuwait. The Kingman girl's basketball team advanced to the Sub State finals with a 57-39 win over Clearwater, but lost in the finals to Andale 66-35. Krystal Proctor, a seventh-grader at Norwich, won the Kingman County Spelling Bee and qualified for the state bee in Topeka. Kingman County Commissioners heard presentations from two companies who submitted proposals to update the courthouse's telephone system. The Norwich Junior High boy's basketball team won the Great Golden Plains Tournament of Champions and capped a 29-1 season.

### 60 Years Ago

A total of 1,149 pigs sold for an average of \$32.40 a head during the feeder pig auction held at the Kingman County Fairgrounds. The Kingman Recreation Commission sought interest from the community about the possibility of an archery club. Kingman Jaycess Club President David Gaumer announced the club would start a welfare investigation program to determine how many recipients met requirements and if they were using welfare for food, shelter and clothing. Leroy E. Pit-

man, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Pitman of Kingman, was named a staff officer for the Air Force ROTC Cadet Wing at Kansas State University. The Paint Pot art gallery displayed a number of paintings created by Kingman High School students; the display would last for two weeks. Rosemary Wood was named the Kingman American Legion Auxiliary's representative for the 24th annual Sunflower Girls State. Richard Fettig of Kingman bowled a 300 game at Kingman Lanes. Safeway advertised Campbell's Soup at six cans for \$1.

### 85 Years Ago

Local mortician O.H. "Pat" Funk announced he would run for the Kingman school board. Local business owner Dwight Cromer announced he would run for the office of commissioner of Kingman streets and utilities. Kingman Grade School musicians were set to perform under the direction of Mac Reynolds Stanley. A widespread search for three-year-old Jerry Conrad, the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Conrad of Spivey, ended seven hours later after the boy was found unharmed, sleeping in a clump of weeds on a creek bank in the Oscar Pipkin pasture several miles from his home. Kingman County sportsmen showed their enthusiasm for a bill introduced in the state Legislature that would change the manner in which Kansas Fish and Game Commission members were named. A photograph of downtown Kingman showed large snowflakes falling, with eight to 10 inches falling in the county.
